Wind Speed >>>>>> 74-95 mph

No real damage to buildings

Damage to unanchored mobile homes

Some damage to poorly constructed signs

Some coastal road flooding

Minor pier damage

2

Wind Speed >>>>>> 96-110 mph

Some damage to roofs, doors, & windows

Considerable damage to mobile homes

Damage to piers

Some trees blown down

Coastal flooding

CATEGORY

3

Wind Speed >>>>>> 111-130 mph

Some structural damage to small residences

Large trees blown down

Mobile homes destroyed

Flooding near coast with floating debris

CATEGORY

4

Wind Speed >>>>>> 131-155 mph

Some extensive structural damages

Extensive damage to windows & doors

Major damage to lower floors near shores

Major beach erosion

Inland floods

CATEGORY

5

Wind Speed >>>>>> >155 mph

Complete roof failure

Severe damage to windows & doors

Some complete building failures

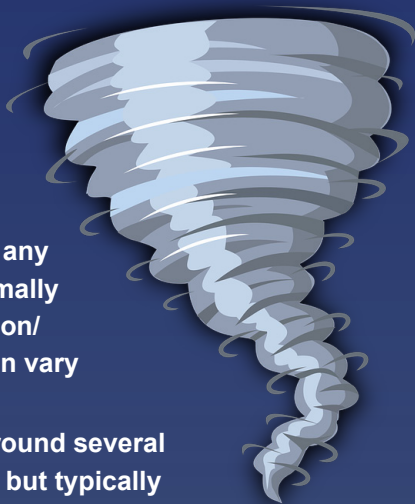
Major flooding damage to lower floors

Massive evacuation may be required

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TORNADO WARNING SIGNS



Tornadoes can strike at any time of the day, but normally occur in the late afternoon/early evening. Speed can vary from 30 mph to 70 mph.

Tornadoes can touch ground several times in different areas, but typically stay on the ground for no more than 20 minutes.

Tornadoes can occur suddenly, so here are some atmospheric warning signs that a tornado may develop.

- Dark, often greenish sky
- Large hail often in the absence of rain
- Loud roar similar to a freight train
- Approaching cloud of debris
